Rotary's Future Vision Project...Big changes coming

Throughout the Rotary world, districts want to be part of The Rotary Foundation Future Vision Plan pilot. By the 15 May deadline, more than half of Rotary Districts had applied. About 100 districts will be chosen to participate in the pilot.

The selected districts will help test a new Foundation grant structure. To streamline the grant-making process, the plan will offer only two grant types: Rotary Foundation District Grants and Rotary Foundation Global Grants.

Rotary Foundation District Grants are block grants made to districts for up to 50% of their District Designated Fund. Districts can use these grants to fund scholarships, support vocational training teams, sponsor volunteer service, provide disaster relief and carry out community and international service projects. District grants allow Rotarians to respond quickly to urgent needs and to plan smaller projects in their communities and abroad that fit within the mission of The Rotary Foundation.

Rotary Foundation Global Grants which have a minimum of \$15,000 and maximum of \$200,000 support larger humanitarian projects with sustainable, high-impact outcomes in one of six areas of focus: Peace and conflict resolution; Disease prevention/treatment; Water and sanitation; Maternal and child health; Education and literacy; Economic and community development.

There will be two types of global grants: Club and District-developed grants partially funded by sponsors will receive a match from the Foundation's World Fund. Packaged Global Grants will be developed by the Foundation in collaboration with Rotarians and Strategic Partners and funded 100% by the World Fund and Strategic Partners.

After the pilot program, all Districts will operate under the new structure in 2013. The Global Grants will enable Rotarians to reach a greater number of people and do greater good, Rotary will gain greater prominence in the focus areas, there will be increase in membership and contributions to the Foundation and program operation expenses will be reduced.
