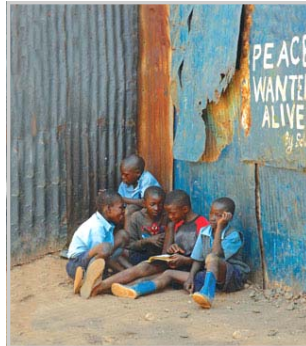

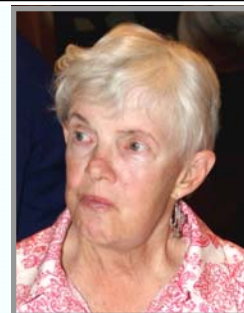
First place. Steve Baroch, Rotary Club of Castle Rock High Noon, Colorado, USA. "The writing on the wall has everything to do with what makes this photo. And each of the kids has a different emotion going on. A lot of the kids in this school are orphans, and some came from an orphanage that was burned to the ground in the post election violence in 2008. *Comment: "Peace wanted alive" is very dramatic, yet the picture is very peaceful.*"



Honorable mention. Daniel Wherry, Rotary Club of Lincoln, Nebraska., USA. "The Sons of Thunder orphanage is the beneficiary of a Matching Grant with District 5650 [Iowa; Nebraska, USA] and the Rotary Club of Livingstone, Zambia. I was taking pictures of the beautiful Zambian sunset and just happened to catch this shot of one of the boys standing on the wall looking out over the bush. For me, this captured the hope we have for these children – that we could be a small part in making their dreams real." *Comment: "Normally, I don't go for sunsets, but there's something very dramatic about this."*



Honorable mention. Nick Phillips, Rotary Club of Eshowe, South Africa. "When brush fires devastated the Mhlathuzana community in August, more than 50 families lost their homes. Many people had only the clothes they were wearing. The Zulufadder NGO [nongovernmental organization] and clubs in District 9270 responded with food, blankets, clothing, and money. Resigned but not defeated, these women were making their way over the scorched earth toward their burnt-out homes. Today, all the houses that were burnt have been rebuilt, and it is impossible to see where the fires occurred." *Comment: "The shoe is telling. When I see this, I want to know more."*
